



THE purpose of the Annual General Meeting and Conference of the Pakistan Society of Development Economists (PSDE) is to provide a forum where leading professional economists and policy-makers can exchange ideas on the vital economic and social issues facing Pakistan. With the passage of time, the philosophy of development has undergone a profound change. There is now, as never before, an increasing awareness of the complexities involved in the development process which has engendered a greater sense of realism.

In Pakistan's development experience, a number of problems typically confronting developing countries in their progress towards a self-reliant economy have been tackled. These problems are complex and multidimensional in nature. High rates of population growth, uneven distribution of income, low literacy rates, poor health facilities, relatively low savings rates, large internal and external deficits, and inadequate physical infrastructure for energy generation and communications threaten to nullify the modest economic gains made here, as in many other developing countries. Despite these problems, the development process in Pakistan has progressed reasonably well, although not without encountering difficulties.

The Annual General Meeting and Conference of the Society is also an occasion for stock-taking of the work done on various socioeconomic problems of Pakistan at PIDE and elsewhere, as well as for suggesting new initiatives for further research. These Meetings provide for the much-needed communication amongst the economics profession, policy-makers, and various schools of interested observers of the ongoing debate concerning development.

The Fourteenth Annual General Meeting, being held on January 28-31, 1999, will address such important topics as self-reliance in agriculture, dynamics for social transformation, macro management, problems of economics teaching and research in Pakistan, population dynamics, industrial policy and development issues, global interdependence, gender issues, income distribution and savings behaviour, technological development, information technology, human resource development, sustainable agriculture, poverty alleviation strategies, and monetary and fiscal issues. A highlight of this year's Conference is the Inaugural Address by Wasim Sajjad, Chairman, Senate of Pakistan. The Keynote Address will be give by Ahsan Iqbal, Deputy Chairman of the Planning Commission and Chief Co-ordinator of the Prime Minister's 2010 Programme. The Quaid-i-Azam Memorial Lecture, being delivered by Albert Berry of the University of Toronto, is titled "The Potential Role of the SME Sector in Pakistan in a World of Increasing International Trade". The Iqbal Memorial Lecture, by Paul P. Streeten of Boston University, will be "Globalisation: Threat or Opportunity?" The Mahbub ul Haq Memorial Lecture, by Parvez Hasan, formerly of the World Bank, is titled "Pakistan at the Threshold of the 21st Century: How to Shape a Better Economic Future?". Speakers in the Distinguished Lectures series include Mohsin S. Khan, Christophe Jaffrelot, and John Williamson.
